1 Globelics Academy in Tampere – background

The 5th Globelics Academy Ph.D. School will take place in June 2008 in Tampere, Finland. Globelics Academy supports the training of Ph.D. students from different parts of the world who are writing dissertations on issues related with innovation systems. The Academy brings together frontier researchers in innovation with Ph.D. students from developing countries in order to inspire and qualify their work as well as to help them to join high-quality research networks in their field of research.

The Globelics Academy originates from and is connected to the world-wide research network Globelics, initiated by Professor Bengt-Åke Lundvall, IKE-group, Aalborg University and Professor Luc Soete, UNU-MERIT (<http://www.globelics.org/>), bringing together scholars working on the national systems of innovation.

Previously, Globelics Academy has taken place four times in Lisbon, Portugal (from 2004 to 2007) and will now take turns with Tampere, Finland, so that in 2008 and 2010 the Academy will be organized in Tampere by TaSTI, University of Tampere. In Lisbon the Academy is jointly organized by the Centre for Innovation, Technology and Policy Research, IN+, at Instituto Superior Técnico (IST), Technical University of Lisbon and by the Instituto Superior de Economia e Gestão (ISEG), the Economics and Business Administration Institute, Technical University of Lisbon. The secretariat and local coordination in Lisbon have included Professor Rui Baptista (IST), Professor Manuel Mira Godinho (ISEG) and Cristina Oliveira (IST). In Tampere Research Director Erkki Kaukonen, Academic Coordinator Mika Raunio and Senior Researcher Mika Kautonen from TaSTI (Unit for Science, Technology and Innovation Studies) will be coordinating the Academy with the support of the Lisbon team.

The Globelics Academy aims at improving the students' ability to undertake theoretically informed and policy-relevant empirical work on issues related with innovation in firms and societies, and its relationship with economic development. To qualify for participation, the Ph.D. student should

- be at least at the beginning of his/her second year;
- work explicitly on issues related to innovation and development;
- be able to present an original paper associated with his/her doctoral work.

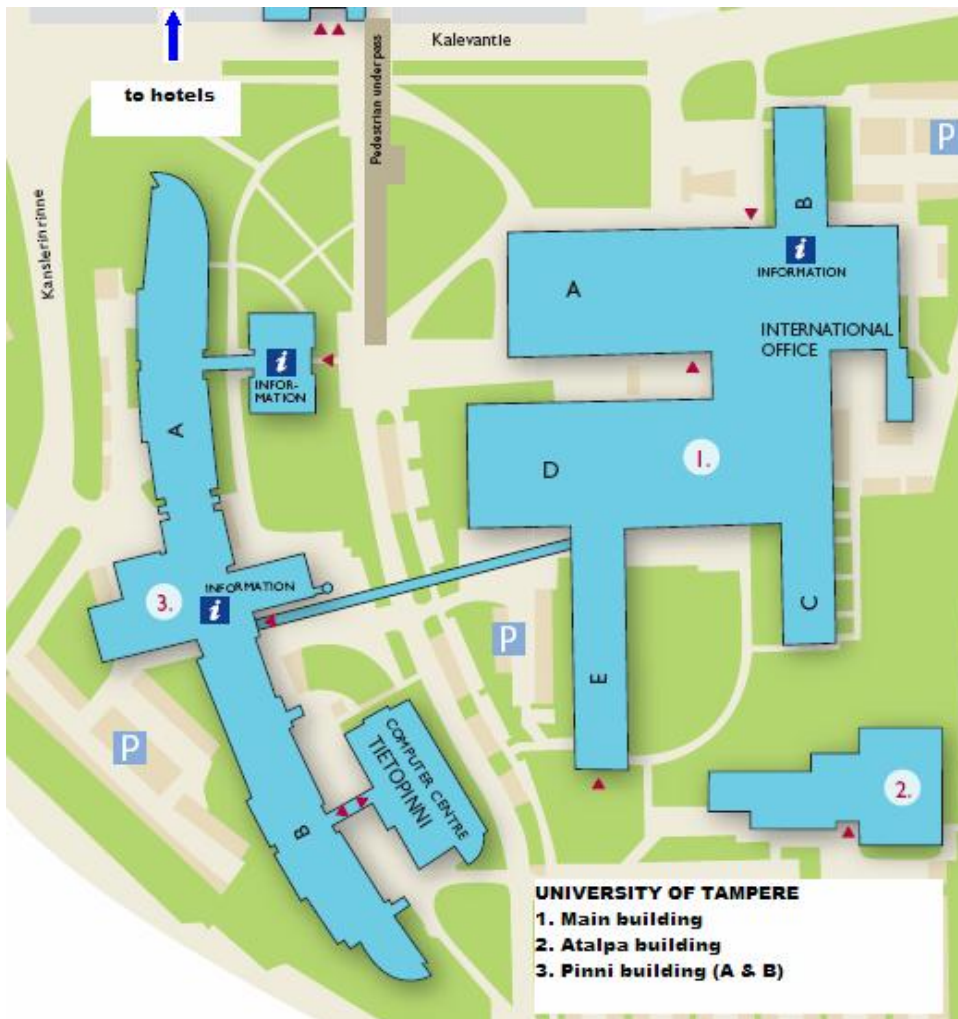
2 Location of the Academy 2008



Globelics Academy 2008 takes place in the city of Tampere. Tampere city-region is the second largest city-region in Finland with more than 300 000 inhabitants. It is located 180 km north of the city of Helsinki. The industrial development of Tampere initiated in the 18th century and the city was called “Manchester of Finland” due to its numerous industrial factories. From the 1970s onwards the decline of traditional industries shook the economic structure of the city-region and turn towards more knowledge based industries took place in the 1980s and the 1990s. Now Tampere city-region is the key centre for research and development in Finland next to the capital region of Helsinki. Tampere region accounts 13 - 15% of national spending on both private and public-sector R&D.

Tampere offers a wide selection of cultural amenities and has been selected as “the most attractive city of Finland” several times. There is an international airport in Tampere and high-speed trains connect Tampere to other main city-regions of Finland.

3 Location of lectures: University of Tampere, Pinni B building



Lectures for students will take place at the University of Tampere, Pinni B building, room B 3076 3rd floor.

Open lectures take place in auditorium B1097 on the entrance floor

Panel discussion takes place in auditorium B3116, 3rd floor

4 Lunches during the academy

Lunch will be served at the university's restaurant, Minerva, (Pinni B building, 2nd floor), Mon to Fri from 12:30 onwards. You will get lunch vouchers, which you need to present at the till in order to receive your meal free of charge.

Lunch includes the following:

One main course +

- side dish from salad buffet
- portion of bread (up to 3 slices and spread)

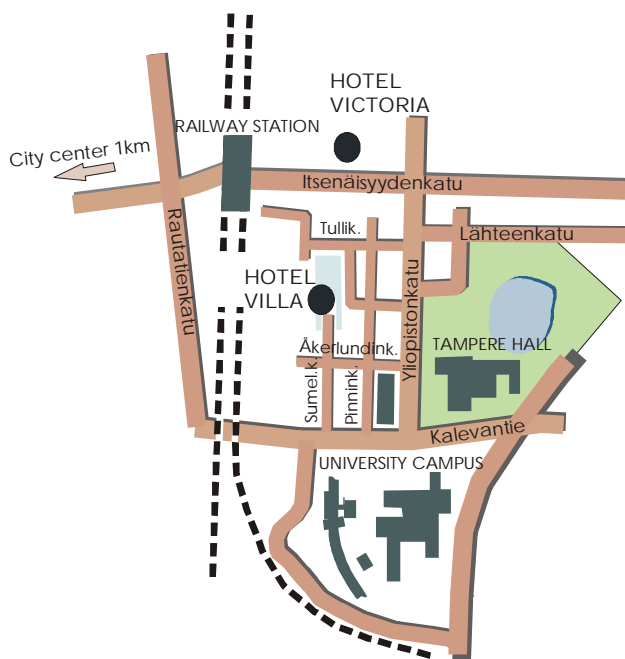

5 Accommodation: Hotel Sokos Villa and Hotel Victoria

Reservations have been made for the participants from two nearby hotels; the Hotel Victoria for students and the Hotel Sokos Villa for professors. Distances from hotels to University (Pinni B building) are approximately 400 meters from the Hotel Victoria (students) and 150 meters from the Hotel Villa (professors).

The Sokos Hotel Villa is a cozy and warm-hearted hotel offering a friendly atmosphere for your stay in Tampere. The hotel, built in an old granary, is located by the Tullintori commercial centre. The railway station, Tampere Hall and the University are all within walking distance. The hotel has 96 welcoming rooms. There is a restaurant, a lobby bar and a pub, business centre and meeting rooms.

Excursion 2) Vapriikki – The industrial history of Tampere region (City center)

Wednesday 11th, 16:00 – 17:00: The development of Tampere region is explained in the industrial heart lands of Tampere, where James Finlayson from Scotland established the first factories in the 19th century and where the first electric light pulp of Nordic countries was lit. Later traditional heavy machinery and metal industries were transformed to automation and more sophisticated industries by integrating ICT and in co-operation with Technical University.

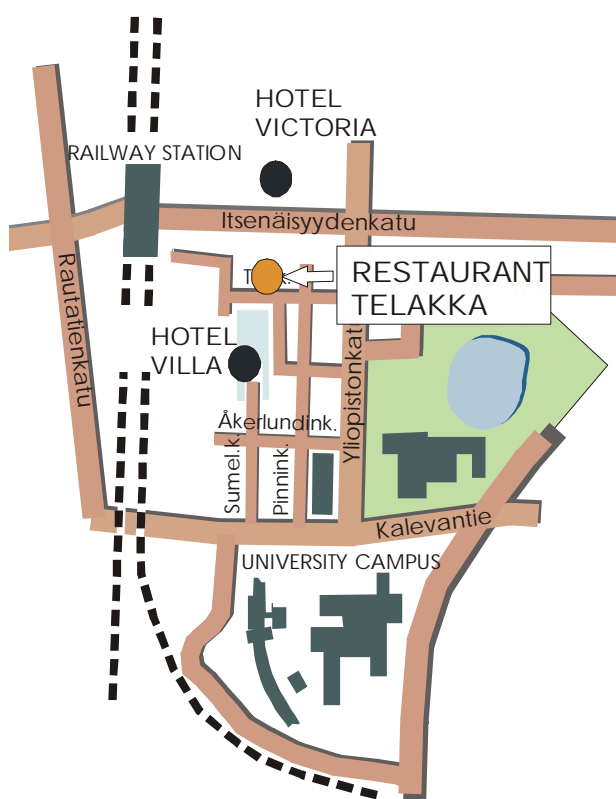

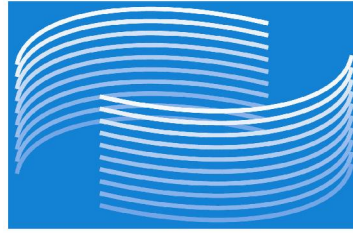
